CDC Guidelines:

I have received multiple inquires about what is considered a first-hand contact and what requires someone to quarantine. Attached is the link (https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/php/public-health-recommendations.html)and enclosed is the direct statement. Please understand, this definition is not the same as Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE)-https://www.coronavirus.kdheks.gov/DocumentCenter/View/949/COVID-19-Disease-Investigation-Guideline-PDF---10-2020?bidld= as their threshold is 10 minutes, but the Exposure to section is the same: Person with COVID-19 who has symptoms (in the period from 2 days before symptom onset until they meet criteria for discontinuing home isolation; can be laboratory-confirmed or a clinically compatible illness)

Person	Exposure to	Recommended Precautions for the Public
Individual who has had <u>close contact</u> (within 6 feet for a total of 15 minutes or more)	 Person with COVID-19 who has <u>symptoms</u> (in the period from 2 days before symptom onset until they meet criteria for <u>discontinuing home isolation</u>; can be laboratory-confirmed or a clinically compatible illness) Person who has tested positive for COVID-19 (laboratory confirmed) but has not had any <u>symptoms</u> (in the 2 days before the date of specimen collection until they meet criteria for <u>discontinuing home isolation</u>). Note: This is irrespective of whether the person with COVID-19 or the contact was wearing a mask or whether the contact was wearing respiratory personal protective equipment (PPE) 	Stay home until 14 days after last exposure and maintain social distance (at least 6 feet) from others at all times Self-monitor for symptoms Check temperature twice a day Watch for fever*, cough, or shortness of breath, or other symptoms of COVID-19 Avoid contact with people at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19 Follow CDC guidance if symptoms develop
